POLICY FOR DONATION OF USED PIANOS:

It is the goal of The Piano Bank, a program of the Mundi Project, to provide donated, used pianos to families who would not otherwise have access to them. We would like to distribute the higher-grade pianos to the more experienced students, and when possible trade them for lower grade pianos, which can be donated to beginning students.

The Piano Bank will oversee the moving of the piano to the applicant's home, and the tuning. Ownership of the piano is passed on to the applicant at the time of delivery. The Piano Bank will assist the recipient with one subsequent annual tuning if they contact us approximately one month prior to the anniversary of the piano's receipt.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY:

All applications will be reviewed by the Piano Bank Committee. In the event there is a conflict of interest between the applying family and a Piano Bank Committee member, (including the case in which the family applying to receive a piano has one or more students currently or previously studying with one or more of the committee members), the affected board member(s) will remove themselves from the room during the discussion of the family involved and will refrain from voting in that session.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS NEEDED TO QUALIFY FOR A PIANO FROM THE PIANO BANK?

- ❖ The ability to finance piano lessons on an ongoing basis
- ❖ A piano teacher who will sponsor you
- ❖ A financial need, household income under \$50,000
- ❖ You must live along the Wasatch Front (Ogden to Provo)
- ❖ Applicant must be 17 years of age or younger
- ❖ Applicants need at least one, preferable two years of formal piano study

WHAT IS THE DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS?

The Piano Bank Committee reviews all applications quarterly. A response will be given within two weeks of the deadline. The deadlines are: January 10, April 10, July 10, and October 10.
